CONTROL OF POLLUTION ACT 1974

DISPOSAL LICENCE

Walsall Metropolitan Borough Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Control of Pollution Act 1974, hereby license Mr Derek Alfred Cooper trading as Darlaston Tyre Co., Cemetery Road, Darlaston, Walsall, WS10 8NA (hereinafter called the "licence holder") to operate a tyre storage and transfer facility on land at Cemetery Road, Darlaston, Walsall, which is shown edged red on the drawing attached to this licence, being land occupied by the licence holder.

This licence is granted subject to the conditions set out in the schedules attached hereto.



NOTES

These notes are for general guidance only and they do not constitute an authoritative statement of the law.

This licence permits the deposit, sorting and storing of certain wastes under controlled conditions and is not intended to permit the sorting, storing, transfer or treatment of wastes except to the extent expressly referred to in the Schedules.

Definitions of certain words and phrases used in this licence are to be found in Schedule B.

This licence relates only to the requirements of the Control of Pollution Act 1974 for the deposit of waste and the use of plant or equipment subject to the conditions set out in the Schedules and does not constitute a consent required by any other legislation. In particular it is the responsibility of the licence holder to comply with any requirements of the Health and Safety at Work etc Act 1974, the Radioactive Substances Act 1960, the Town and Country Planning Acts, and all relevant water protection and environmental health legislation.

The storage of flammable materials including tyres is controlled by the provisions of the West Midlands County Council Act 1980 and the licence holder is strongly advised to familiarise himself with the requirements of Part VII of this Act.

If the licence holder ceases to occupy the land specified above, then he may transfer the licence to the new occupier after giving notice to the Waste Disposal Authority who has the right to decline to accept the new licence holder.

If the licence holder wishes to cancel this licence, he must return it to the Waste Disposal Authority together with a notice stating he no longer requires the licence. Cancellation of the licence will not affect any outstanding liability of the licence holder under the conditions of the licence.

Contravention of Licence Conditions

Your attention is drawn to the provisions of Sections 3, 9 and 16 of the Control of Pollution Act 1974.

Section 3

Prohibits under penalty the deposit of waste, or the use of plant or equipment, otherwise than in accordance with the terms of a licence. This Section applies to all the conditions contained herein, including any which may be the subject of appeal to the Secretary of State under Section 10 of the Act.

Any deposit which takes place without compliance with all the licence conditions may lead to prosecution under this Section. A person who contravenes Section 3 subsection (1) shall, subject to subsection (4), be guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction to a fine of an amount not exceeding £5,000 (at the date of issue of this licence), or on conviction on indictment to imprisonment for a term not exceeding two years or a fine or both.




Section 9

Non compliance with any licence conditions may lead to the revocation of this licence.

Section 16

The licensing authority is empowered to require the removal of any controlled waste deposited in circumstances where any of the conditions contained in this licence are not being complied with, or the undertaking of such works as are required to reduce or eliminate the consequences of such deposits.

Schedule A

1. (a) The statement of intended methods of operation and accompanying drawings entitled "Application for registration as a waste transfer station by Darlaston Tyre Company" dated 13th November 1992 and subsequent letter dated 15th May 1993 submitted as part of the application for this licence shall be referred to as the working plan.
- (b) No operations shall take place at the facility unless the working plan has been approved in writing by the Waste Disposal Authority (the WDA).
- (c) Any subsequent proposed change in the working plan shall be notified in writing to the WDA and the proposed change shall not be implemented until it has been approved in writing by the WDA.
- (d) Any reference in this licence to the working plan shall include a reference to any changes to the statement or the drawings which have been approved in writing by the WDA.
- (e) Subject to the terms of this licence, the facility shall be operated in accordance with the working plan.
2. The type of waste deposited at the facility shall consist only of vehicle tyres. The maximum number of tyres deposited each working day at the facility shall not exceed 3000. Notwithstanding this, tyres shall only be deposited at the facility when there is sufficient storage capacity available in the areas detailed in the working plan.
3. (a) All incoming tyres for sorting shall be unloaded in the area shown in the working plan and stored pending sorting.
- (b) Scrap tyres awaiting removal from the facility shall only be stored in the scrap tyre area detailed in the working plan. The number of scrap tyres awaiting removal from the facility shall not exceed 1000.
- (c) Tyres suitable for reclamation shall be transferred to the designated storage areas reserved for this purpose as detailed in the working plan. The number of tyres awaiting reclamation shall not exceed 19000.



4. Tyres shall not be stored to a height greater than 3 metres. Notwithstanding this, no tyres stored in the open yard shall be stored to a height in excess of the nearest boundary wall/fence.
5. Deposit, removal and sorting of waste shall only take place between the hours of 0730 and 1700 on Mondays to Fridays and 0830 and 1500 on Saturdays. Except in circumstances of emergency no deposit, removal or sorting of waste shall take place outside these hours or on Sundays, Christmas Day, Bank Holidays or other public holidays without the prior approval of the WDA. All circumstances of emergency shall be reported forthwith to the WDA and confirmed in writing within 3 working days.
6. Notwithstanding condition 5 no waste handling operations at the facility shall take place during the hours of darkness as defined by the Science and Engineering Research Council.
7. An identification board of durable material and finish shall be permanently displayed at the entrance to the facility. This shall show the licence number of the facility and shall give the name, address and telephone number of the operator and of the WDA and a telephone number through which a responsible person may be contacted in the event of an emergency occurring when the facility is unattended.
8. A site control office shall be provided as detailed in the working plan and this shall provide facilities for record keeping.
9. Gates, walls and fences shall be provided and maintained at the facility as detailed in the working plan. Gates shall be locked outside operating hours and at any time when the facility is unattended. All reasonable precautions shall be taken to prevent unauthorised access and/or the unlawful deposit of waste.
10. The yard area at the facility shall be surfaced as detailed in the working plan and maintained in good repair at all times.
11. Drainage facilities shall be provided and maintained to prevent the accumulation of surface water at the facility; the pollution, by solid matter or otherwise, of any watercourse or sewer; and the spillage of contaminated water onto land outside the facility. There shall be no discharge of contaminated water to watercourse or soakaway. All discharges to sewer shall have been previously agreed with Severn Trent Water Limited.
12. (a) Any containers used for the storage of liquids at the facility shall be of a type and construction suitable for the liquids they contain, conform to all relevant safety and construction standards and be labelled to show their contents.

(b) All such containers shall be bunded and each bunded area shall have an impermeable internal surface and a minimum available capacity not less than 110% of the volume of the largest container within that area. Spillages within the bunded areas shall be removed forthwith and rainwater shall not be allowed to accumulate.



13. Spillages shall be contained and removed as detailed in the working plan.
14. Any wastes delivered to or deposited at the facility which are not permitted by the terms of this licence shall be segregated from other waste and shall be removed from the facility within 1 working day of receipt. The WDA shall be informed as soon as practicable of any such occurrence and this shall be confirmed in writing within 3 working days of receipt.
15. Records shall be kept of the types and quantities of wastes deposited at and removed from the facility. These records shall comprise full details as required in a form specified by the WDA and copies shall be sent to the WDA once per month or any other frequency specified by the WDA. These records shall be made available to any representative of the WDA for inspection at the facility at any reasonable time.
16. The facility when open for the deposit, removal or sorting of waste shall be manned and supervised as detailed in the working plan. Supervisors shall be fully conversant with all inspection, loading/unloading procedures, capable of ensuring compliance with this licence and trained to implement emergency procedures as detailed in the working plan.
17. No waste material shall be burnt within the confines of the facility. Any fire occurring within the confines of the facility shall be treated as an emergency and immediate action shall be taken to extinguish it. All outbreaks of fire shall be reported forthwith to the Fire Service and the WDA. Fire fighting equipment shall be provided and regularly maintained in full working order as detailed in the working plan.
18. The facility and its environs shall be kept clean and tidy at all times as detailed in the working plan. The yard shall be swept and litter collected up and disposed of as detailed in the working plan and when requested by the WDA.
19. The facility shall be inspected each working day for vermin and insects. Action shall be taken to deal effectively with any vermin or insects at the facility, as detailed in the working plan. A record shall be kept of any treatment carried out.
20. Measures shall be taken to ensure that mud, debris or any other material is not deposited on any highway by vehicles leaving the facility, as detailed in the working plan.
21. Provision, as detailed in the working plan, shall be made within the confines of the facility for the manoeuvring, parking, loading and unloading of vehicles. Access shall be maintained at all times for vehicles of the emergency services.
22. Measures, including proper maintenance and use, shall be taken to control the noise of vehicles and machinery operating at the facility.



23. Any breakdown or emergency which necessitates the implementation of standby operating and disposal arrangements as detailed in the working plan shall be reported to the WDA forthwith and confirmed in writing within 3 working days.
24. Provision shall be made to allow safe access to all areas of the facility at all reasonable times for representatives of the WDA for the purpose of monitoring conditions at the facility.
25. Any actual or anticipated cessation of operations for a period in excess of 1 month shall be notified to the WDA forthwith and confirmed in writing within 2 working days. Not less than 14 days notice shall be given to the WDA of the date on which operations are due to re-commence in the event of a temporary cessation for a period in excess of 1 month.
26. A copy of any notice or instruction received from any authority other than the WDA, which in any way relates to the use of the facility, shall be given to the WDA within 3 working days.
27. The terms of this licence and the approved working plan and any approved amendments to either document shall be made known to any person who is given responsibility for the operation, management or control of the facility and a copy of each of these documents shall be available at the facility at all times.

Schedule B

1. In this licence, an emergency is defined as a case where a person has reasonable cause to believe that circumstances exist which are likely to endanger life or health or cause damage to property or pollution of water.
2. A representative of the WDA means any officer of the Environmental Health and Consumer Services Department and any officer of the West Midlands Hazardous Waste Unit.
3. In this licence forthwith and immediately mean as soon as practicable.

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
