CONTROL OF POLLUTION ACT 1974

LICENCE TO DISPOSE OF WASTE

The County Council of West Midlands in pursuance of the powers conferred on them by the Control of Pollution Act 1974 hereby licence Frost and Sons (Moxley) Ltd of Falcon Galvanising Works, Holyhead Road, Moxley, Walsall (hereinafter called the "licence holder") to deposit controlled waste in accordance with the conditions specified herein on Falcon Galvanising Works, Holyhead Road, Moxley, Walsall which is shown edged red on the drawing attached to this licence being land occupied by the licence holder

This licence is granted subject to the conditions set out in the schedule hereto

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#### NOTES

These notes are for the general guidance of the licence holder and they do not constitute an authoritative statement of the law.

1. This licence only relates to the requirements in the Control of Pollution Act 1974 for the deposit of controlled waste or the use of plant or equipment subject to the conditions set out in the Schedule and does not constitute a consent required by any other legislation. In particular it is the responsibility of the licence holder to comply with any requirements of the Health and Safety at Work etc. Act 1974; the Radioactive Substances Act 1960, The Town and Country Planning Act, Water Protection and Environmental Health Legislation.
2. If the licence holder ceases to occupy the land specified above, then he may transfer the licence to the new occupier after giving notice to the County Waste Disposal Officer that he proposes to transfer the licence on a day specified in the notice. The County Council has the right to decline to accept the new licence holder.
3. If the licence holder wishes to cancel this licence, he must return it to the County Waste Disposal Officer together with a notice stating that he no longer requires the licence. Cancellation of the licence will not affect any outstanding liability of the licence holder under the conditions of the licence.

#### Contravention of Licence Conditions

Your attention is drawn to the provisions of Section 3, 9 and 16 of the Control of Pollution Act, 1974 appended hereto.

#### Section 3

Prohibits under penalty, the depositing of waste or the use of plant or equipment otherwise than in accordance with the terms of a licence. This Section applies to all the conditions contained herein, including any which may be the subject of appeal to the Secretary of State under Section 10 of the Act.



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Any deposit which takes place without compliance with all the licence conditions is illegal and will lead to prosecution under this Section.

#### Section 9

Non compliance with any licence conditions may lead to the revocation of this licence.

#### Section 16

The licencing authority is empowered to require the removal of any controlled waste deposited in circumstances where any of the conditions contained in this licence are not being complied with.

#### Penalties under Section 3

A person who contravenes any of the above provisions subject to Sub-Section (4) shall be guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction to a fine of an amount not exceeding £1,000 or on conviction on indictment to imprisonment for a term not exceeding five years or a fine or both.



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Conditions for use of Mineshaft at:- Falcon Galvanising Works

Licence Holder:- Frost and Sons (Moxley) Limited

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1. The licence holder shall notify the Waste Disposal Authority (hereafter called the WDA) of any proposed change in the actual conduct of operations from the proposals shown in the licence application, as altered by any previously notified changes, at least one month before the proposed change is implemented.
2. Only treated hydrochloric acid liquors and quench water liquor shall be discharged to the facility, and these shall consist only of waste liquors produced on this site by the operations of the licence holder. No waste liquor shall have a pH of less than 6.0 or greater than 10.0.
3. Within six months of the issue of this licence a borehole is to be sunk at a position, depth, and type which shall be to the satisfaction of the WDA.
4. The hydrochloric acid liquors discharged to the mineshaft shall be monitored using suitable continuous recording apparatus which shall be so installed as to provide a permanent record of the pH value of the discharge.
5. Safe sampling positions shall be provided at appropriate locations to enable officers of the WDA to obtain representative samples of the liquors discharged to the mineshaft.
6. All hydrochloric acid liquors for disposal at the facility shall have been treated and their volume recorded to meet the requirements of Conditions 2 and 4, before discharge to the mineshaft.
7. The liquid levels in the shaft shall be monitored daily and measures taken to the satisfaction of the WDA to ensure they do not rise above a level 125.6 metres above ordnance datum. In the event of the standing level of liquid rising above this level, all discharges to the mineshaft shall cease forthwith and all excess liquid removed in order to reduce the standing level to below 125.6m (OD) and the WDA notified immediately.



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8. Management and technical supervision shall be provided at the facility throughout operating hours and during all maintenance operations.
9. Standby operating and disposal arrangements shall be implemented in the case of a breakdown or other emergency situation developing at the facility. The WDA shall be informed immediately whenever these arrangements are implemented.
10. A record shall be kept of the quantities and quality of all discharges to the facility, including details of pH, flow rate with daily totals, and that of the daily recorded level of liquids in the mineshaft. These records, in a form approved by the WDA shall be sent to the WDA once a month or at a frequency as may be requested by the WDA. These records shall be made available to any representative of the WDA for inspection at the facility at any reasonable time.
11. Within 3 months of the date of issue of this licence proposals shall be submitted in writing to the WDA showing details of the proposed works to be carried out for the treatment of the mineshaft to render it safe when disposal has ceased.
12. Any temporary cessation of operations for a period in excess of 3 months shall be notified to the WDA. Not less than 14 days notice shall be given to the WDA of the date on which operations are to recommence in the event of a temporary cessation for a period in excess of 3 months.
13. The terms of this licence shall be made known to any person who is given responsibility for the management or control of the facility, and a copy shall also be displayed at a prominent position at the facility.
14. Tanks used for the storage or treatment of liquid wastes shall be banded and the areas surrounding them shall be contoured to ensure spillages are either contained or drained to intermediate buffer vessels. They shall be of a type and construction suitable for the wastes they contain and shall be labelled to show their contents.
